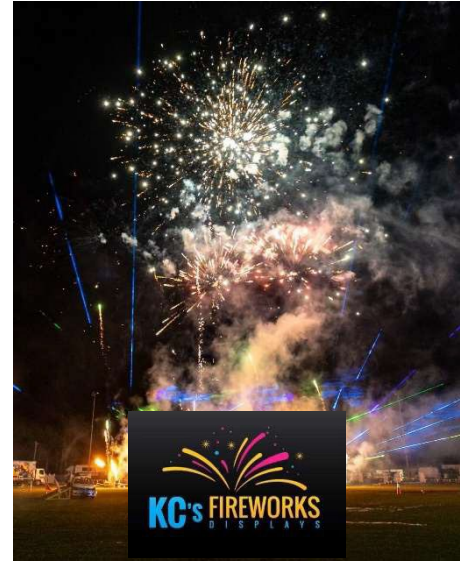

PRIZE MONEY can be collected from the Show Hall Office between 9 - 11am on SUNDAY 18 May 2025.	
<b>WORKPLACE HEALTH &amp; SAFETY ACT</b>	<p>Any exhibitor intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showgrounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with earth leakage circuit breakers and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected and tagged by a licensed electrical contractor. This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors and the general public and a requirement of the Electrical Safety Regulation 2002, Part 5/Division 5.</p> <p>This Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of non-compliance with its provisions. Any exhibitor who does not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at the Biggenden Showgrounds. Exhibitors should check all electrical equipment and leads before coming to the Showgrounds to avoid the occurrence of any difficulties.</p>
<b>RULES</b>	The Biggenden Agricultural & Pastoral Society Inc. conducts all competitions under the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies Inc. rules for the conduct of Agricultural Show Competitions. <b>PAVILION ENTRIES</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▶ ALL exhibits are collected with prize money, between 9 - 11am SUNDAY 17 May 2026.</li> <li>▶ Entries are the responsibilities of the owner to be collected and disposed of. Under NO circumstances will items be released for collection prior to this time.</li> <li>▶ All exhibits not collected by 11am SUNDAY 17 May 2026 will be disposed of, unless prior arrangements are made with the Secretary.</li> <li>▶ Check the introduction to each specific section for times when the Secretary will be available for accepting entries and the closing time for entries in each individual section.</li> <li>▶ All Stewards to remain with their Sections during judging times and all other persons are asked to vacate the area. Hall entry fees, unless specified, are \$1.00 per entry and must accompany the entry form.</li> <li>▶ All exhibits must be in their allotted position by 5.00 pm FRIDAY, 15 May 2026 and tags must accompany all exhibits. <b>ENTRIES</b>	All entries will be purchased and paid on Show Day. Completed Horse Health Declaration Forms (page 34) and Waiver, Release and Acknowledgement Forms (page 36) must be handed to the Chief Steward, before judging commences. Tickets must be filled in and handed to the steward before judging commences. Prize Money will be paid out from the ring.
<b>DISTRICT RIDER</b>	Refers to horse and rider who reside within 100km of our Showgrounds.

*ALL Floats/Trucks for Horses/Cattle must ONLY enter via GATE in NETTE STREET.*

<b>SPECIAL REGULATIONS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▶ Stallions or Colts are not allowed to compete in any hack class.</li> <li>▶ Any Stallions or Colts under saddle must be suitably controlled or may be removed at Judge's discretion.</li> <li>▶ Stallions and Colts must be ridden by rider 18 years and over.</li> <li>▶ All Stallions to be suitably restrained and if stabling not available they need to wear a collar and be securely tied.</li> <li>▶ Stalls may be reserved but are limited. Horses within a radius of 8km of Biggenden may use stalls after travelling horses have been accommodated.</li> <li>▶ No application accepted unless accompanied by the fee.</li> <li>▶ Horses must be paraded on the days and at times advertised or disqualification may be incurred.</li> <li>▶ An Official of the Society will measure all horses on the grounds prior to judging if deemed necessary.</li> <li>▶ No horses will enter the arena with ribbons on, except in the Grand Parade, and only then with ribbons won at the current show.</li> <li>▶ All exhibits must be free from hereditary un-soundness and contagious diseases.</li> <li>▶ No entry accepted unless name of horse is on the ticket.</li> <li>▶ All horses must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor at time of entry.</li> <li>▶ All exhibitors must be financial members of their respective breed Society and the Stewards reserve the right to inspect registration papers.</li> <li>▶ Competitors are asked to always keep their horses in the designated areas.</li> <li>▶ No horses are to be ridden within a radius of 30m of the show hall and canteen and DEFINITELY no horses to be ridden in front of the Show Hall.</li> <li>▶ Entrants in the WPCS (Welsh Pony) Classes are to be judged under the rules and regulations of the WPCS of Australia, i.e. must be registered, pure bred, unplaited and unclipped. Registration papers are to be presented upon request.</li> <li>▶ Where there are less than four competitors in an event, first to third place ribbons will be awarded. 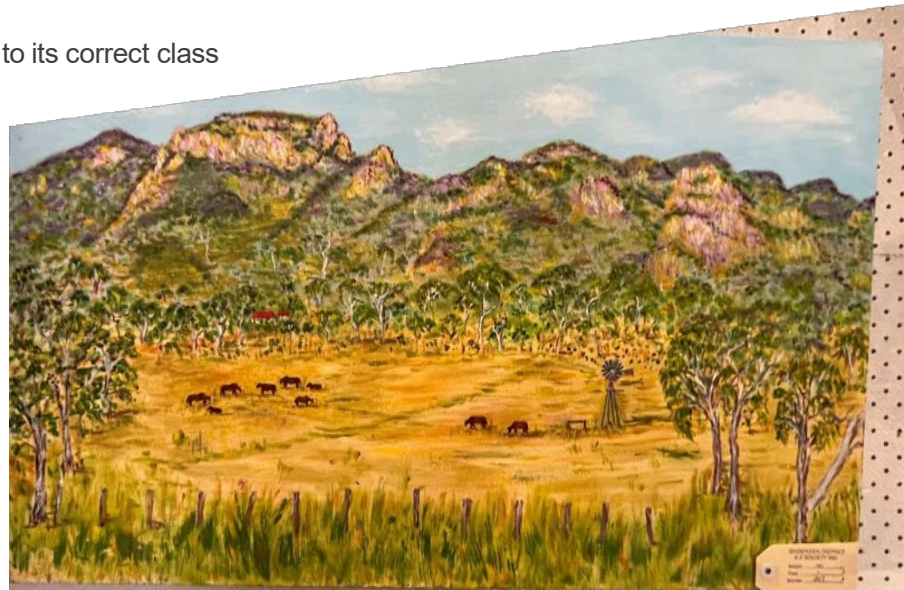

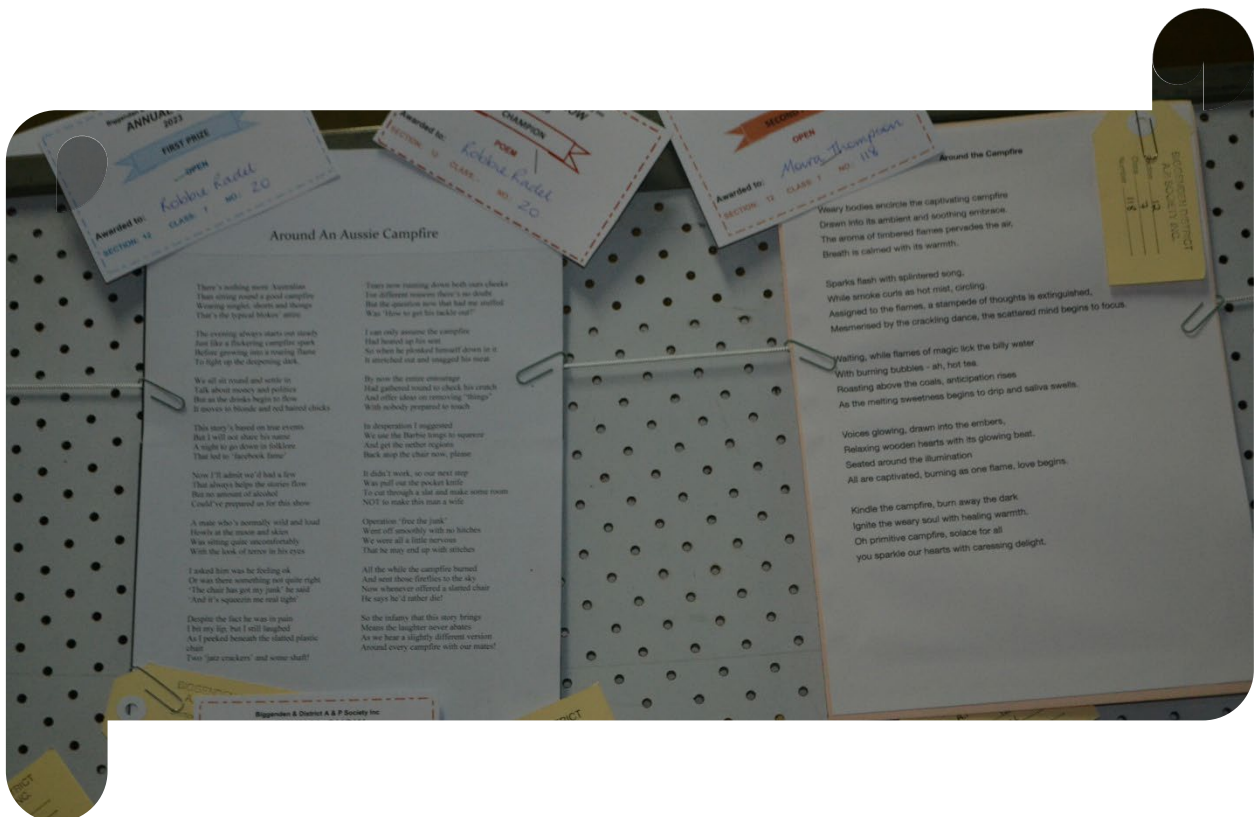
