- ▶ Where weights and measures are stipulated, they are to be taken as approximate.
- ▶ Roots will be judged in accordance with their excellence in the following points, e.g. perfection of forms, fitness of neck or taproot, as well as firmness and smoothness of skin, solidity, weight, and size. Such roots as an experienced Judge would select as the truest and perfect for producing seed for table use, rather than the specimens of the greatest size, are preferred.
- ▶ Exhibits will be cut to be judged.
